Sammy Seagull's Summer Safety Story




Notes to Practitioners



Dad



In the summer, it's lots of fun, To play outside, in the sun.


Just remember - put on a hat,

Drink lots of water, that's the rule!






Perfect! Now you know my 'Summer Safety Song', you can help me keep people safe and happy at the beach.

Can you help me keep Lucia and her family safe at my beach?





This is Lucia, her Mummy and Daddy and little brother Joseph. They had been in the car, for what Lucia thought was a very long time, when they were finally at the beach!

What does the family need to do?










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



There's something else Lucia can do if she is feeling hot – what else is it important to do?






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Dad reached over and gave Lucia her bottle of cool water. "Great!" said Lucia, "That's much better!"

The family were having a lovely time at the beach. There were lots and lots of other people on the beach too.




To keep safe when you're by the sea,

Stay by the shore and you won't go wrong.







"I know!" she said, "I need a shell for the top of my castle!" Lucia jumped up and began to run towards the sea...



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




Should Lucia go further out into the sea?




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
